Tinatin Khidasheli

Tinatin Khidasheli heads a Georgian think-thank Civic — IDEA, fighting soviet legacy in Georgia, confronting Russian and Chinese influence operations in South Caucasus and Central Asia and advocating for sound defense and security policy for Georgia. Tinatin is teaching at the Caucasus University bachelor's and Master's programs: Hybrid Warfare and Georgian Defense Policy, as well as a Challenges of 21st century Leadership at the Georgian Institute of Public Administration for Masters Programs students.

Mrs. Khidasheli at different times served as the first female Minister of Defense of Georgia, she chaired the Parliamentary Committee for European Integration as well as the Inquiry Commission into Violations of Freedom of Speech and Telecommunication laws at the Parliament of Georgia. Before that, she was an elected member of the Tbilisi City Council and founder and chair of the Georgian Young Lawyers' Association.



Tinatin was a member of the National Anti-Corruption Council for four years, under the president of Georgia.

Mrs. Khidasheli is a lawyer by education. She holds LLM in International Law from Tbilisi State University and MA in Political Science from Central European University in Hungary. She was awarded a Human Rights Lawyers' scholarship and spent a year at the Washington College of Law and as well as was selected as a Yale World Fellow. Mrs. Khidasheli was presented Freedom Fighter Award by President G W Bush and the CEU Impact award for outstanding Career Achievement. She is a fellow at the Prague Civil Society Center and CEVRO.

Ani Kintsurashvili

Has a Master's Degree in International Relations, International Security and Conflict Studies from Tallinn University. Since February 2020, she serves as a Senior Researcher at Civic IDEA, Georgian NGO and Civil Society Institution, working on the issues of China's economic and information influence in Georgia and worldwide.

Previously, Ani graduated with a Bachelor of Political Science at the University of Georgia and during her studies in Estonia; she also visited the University of Bologna for one semester in frames of Erasmus+ exchange program. In 2015-2016 she served as an intern at the US Embassy and at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia. She was awarded a certificate of appreciation for the exemplary dedication, tireless effort and exceptional resourcefulness in support of US Embassy Regional Security Office. Andrius Kalindra

Andrius Kalindra has been assigned as an Ambassador of the Republic of Lithuania to Georgia since October 2020. Previously, he served as Foreign Policy Adviser to the Prime Minister of Lithuania. In 2015-2020, Mr. Kalindra headed the International and the EU Affairs Group within the Office of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania. In 2012-2014, he was assigned as Minister Counsellor to the UN Security Council and in 2010-2012, to the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Lithuania to the OSCE. Different times he also served at the Ministry of Transport and Communications and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Lithuania.

Mr. Ambassador holds Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Vytautas Magnus University, and Master's degree in International Law from the Vytautas Magnus University.

Catherine Tai

Mrs. Tai is the Deputy Director for Asia and the Pacific of the Center for International Private Enterprise. Mr Plamen Tonchev



Mr. Tonchev has been Head of Asia Unit at the Institute of International Economic Relations (IIER), Greece, since 1998. Plamen is a founding member of the European Thinktank Network on China (ETNC) and sits on the EU Chapter of the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (EU CSCAP) committee. Mr Tonchev has published books on Japan, India and Pakistan, as well as articles in academic journals on political/economic co-operation between Europe and Asia.

Plamen's work on China dates back to the 1990s. The list of his recent publications on China includes "China's Road: Into the Western Balkans" (EUISS, 2017); "Along the Road: Sri Lanka's Tale of Two Ports" (EUISS, 2018), "China's Image in Greece, 2008-2018" (co-authored, IIER, 2018); "China's Shift to a New Economic Model: From Quantitative to Qualitative Growth?" (Academy of the Kingdom of Morocco, 2019); "China's Soft Power in Southeast Europe" (Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, 2020); "Impact of COVID19 on ASEM Connectivity" (co-authored, European Commission, 2020); "Sino-Greek Relations in Greek and Chinese Media, 2020" (IIER, 2021), etc.

Ambassador David Aptsiauri

Mr. Aptsiauri is a doctor of Economics and has been published intensively both in Georgian and International journals. His academic career brought him to various parts of the world. From 1994 to 2013 he was teaching at Columbia and Florida Universities in the US. Currently, he is teaching at the Tbilisi State University and various leading Chinese universities.



His professional career is mostly related to the ministry of Foreign affairs of Georgia, where he served as a deputy minister and at different times as Georgia's ambassador to the Republic of Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia, as well as to Mongolia, the Republic of Vietnam and People's Republic of China.

Michal Bogusz

Mr. Bogusz, is a graduate of political science at University of Gdańsk (2001) and international relations at Renmin University of China in Beijing (2005). In 2008 he defended a Ph.D. thesis in political sciences. He has spent nearly nine years studying and working in China. His main expertise among other issues, includes: Foreign policy of the People's Republic of China and Internal policies of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China.







Dr. Tolipov graduated from Tashkent State University. From 1994 till 2005 he had taught at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy in Tashkent, from which he received a PhD in Political Science. His academic career includes teaching at different times at the National University of Uzbekistan, OSCE Academy in Bishkek, as well as at the George Marshall European Center for Security Studies and Geneva Center for Security Policy. He was a Fellow at the NATO Defense College (Rome) in 1997 and 2013; a Fellow at Harvard University (USA) in 1999; and a Visiting Professor at the University of Georgia (USA) in 2004;

Currently he is a Director of the non-governmental Research Institution "Bilim Karvoni" ("Caravan of Knowledge") in Tashkent and Adjunct Professor at the Webster University in Tashkent. Dr. Tolipov is specialized in geopolitics, regional security and regional integration in Central Asia, nationalism and democratization in Central Asian countries.

Dr. Tolipov is a member of the international editorial board of the journal "Central Asia and Caucasus". He is also a member of the expert group of the journal "Security Index" of the PIR-Center (Russia) and the Central Eurasian Studies Society.



Wu, Min Hsuan

Wu, Min Hsuan, also known as Ttcat, is co-founder and CEO of Doublethink Lab. He is focused on mapping China's online information operation mechanisms and facilitating the global CSO network to combat digital authoritarianism. For over a decade and a half, he has committed to LGBTIQA+, environment, open government, and digital rights movement as an activist and campaigner.

Patrycja Pendrakowska

Mrs. Pendrakowska founder and the head of the Boym Institute based in Warsaw and analyst of China's foreign policy and economy. On behalf of the Institute, she works on EU-ASEAN relations within the EANGAGE project coordinated by KAS Singapore and on Betzavta method with the Adam Institute for Peace and Democracy in Jerusalem. She is one of the founding members of the board at WICCI's India-EU Business council based in Mumbai and coordinated the Transcultural Research Group on the Belt and Road Initiative organised by the Leadership Excellence Institute Zeppelin. Ms Pendrakowska is a PhD candidate at the Humboldt University in Berlin, where she researches political philosophy in China. She graduated from the University of Warsaw with a BA in Sinology, Sociology and Philosophy, and holds two master's degrees in Financial Law, as well as Ethnography and Cultural Anthropology from the University of Warsaw.



Matej Šimalčík

Mr. Šimalčík is the Executive Director of the Central European Institute of Asian Studies, a think tank that focuses on foreign and security policy issues related to East Asia. Matej's research looks at China's economic and political presence and influence in Central Europe, elite relations, corrosive capital as well as the role of European legal instruments in mitigating risks posed by China.

In 2021, he was listed on the Forbes 30 Under 30 list (Slovak edition) in the category governance and social innovation. He is also a member of the Expert Pool at the European Center of Excellence for Countering Hybrid Threats (Hybrid CoE). He has a background in Law (Masaryk University, 2015) and International Relations (University of Groningen, 2016).



Vusal Guliev



Vusal Guliyev is a 2020–2022 Fellow at the Davis Center for Russian and Eurasian Studies at Harvard University. He is also enrolled as a Ph.D. Candidate in International Politics at the School of International Relations & Public Affairs of Shanghai International Studies University jointly with the SGS Program of Shanghai Municipal Government, where he previously received a Master degree in China Studies under the CSC Program of Chinese Government. While pursuing his Postgraduate Studies, he held a one-semester Fellowship at the Asia-Pacific Research Center of Ankara University in Turkey and attended the International Joint Workshop Series at the Kyushu University of Japan. In addition, he worked as a Research Assistant Intern at the Institute of China Studies of Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences during his Master's degree program. Currently, he is an Associate Expert at the Topchubashov Center, a Baku-based global policy think tank and a Contributing Author at the Baku Research Institute. His recent commentaries and op-eds have appeared in international media outlets such as the Geopolitical Monitor, Eurasia Review, Modern Diplomacy, Jamestown Foundation, SISU Opinion, Politicon, Daily Sabah and CACI Analyst. Besides being a contributing author to the numerous scholarly books, he also writes analytical articles in various languages such as Azerbaijani, Turkish, English, and Chinese with a special interest in the regions of South Caucasus, Central Asia, and the Asia-Pacific.

Dr. Gubad Ibadoghlu

Dr. Ibadoghlu is the holder of a Ph.D. in Economics from the Azerbaijan State University of Economics (UNEC).

He commenced his career at the Economic Research Centre, a Baku-based Think Tank that promotes economic development and good governance. He was a member of the Steering Committee of the EU Eastern Partnership Program's Civil Society Forum (2011-2012) and served as a representative of Eurasian civil society's representative to the international board of the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI) for the 2013–2019. He was elected the first chair of the Azerbaijan Think Tank Association and Movement for democracy and Prosperities in Azerbaijan. Currently, he is a member of the Advisory Board of CAREC Think Tank Network.

He was a researcher at the Higher Economic School, Warsaw in 1999/2000, a Research Fellow at Central European University, Budapest in 2004/2005, a Teaching fellow at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2008/2009, Visiting Professor at Duke University in 2015/2016, Research fellow at Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton in 2017/2018.

Before becoming the current Senior Visiting Fellow at the London School of Economics and Political Sciences (LSE), he was an affiliated postdoc fellow in the Rutgers' Centre for European Studies. He taught four courses (International Political Economy, Globalization, Democracy Contemporary Capitalism, Economics of Transition, Economics οf Natural Resources for Sustainable Development) in the Department of Political Science and Economics at Rutgers University during the 2018-2021 academic years.



Tauno Tohk



Tauno Tohk is the China lead at the Strategic Communications and Information Analysis Division of the European External Action Service, focusing on foreign information manipulation and interference. He was previously a member of Cabinet for the European Commission Vice-President for Digital Single Market, being among other things responsible for coordinating EU's work on countering disinformation. Before that he was a media adviser for the Estonian Government and Prime Minister. Tauno has lived in China and given lectures on Chinese contemporary politics in Estonian universities.

Jean Foster



Jean Foster is the Economic Chief at the U.S. Embassy in Tbilisi, where she covers commercial, macroeconomic, financial sector, and trade issues, among others. As a member of the Foreign Service, Jean has served as a Watch Officer in the State Department's Operations Center in Washington, D.C.; an Economic Officer in Karachi, Pakistan; and a Consular Officer in Beijing, China. Prior to joining the Foreign Service, Jean was a quantitative researcher or engineer at various organizations, including Los Alamos National Laboratory and ExxonMobil. Jean has an MSc in Engineering Science from the University of Oxford and a BSE from Duke University.

Jonas Parello-Plesner

Mr. Parello-Plesner is Executive Director at the Alliance of Democracies Foundation in Copenhagen founded by former NATO Secretary General and Danish Prime Minister, Anders Fogh Rasmussen. Jonas has long-standing experience in the Danish Foreign Service including on US, European and Chinese strategic thinking. From 2013-2017 he was head of department for foreign policy at the Danish Embassy in Washington. He also served in the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs while studying at the Ecole Nationale d'Administration in Paris 2003-2005.



Parello-Plesner has also worked at the European Council on Foreign Relations (ECFR) as a Senior Policy Fellow with a focus on European-Chinese relations from 2010-2013. He served as the Danish Foreign Ministry's Senior Advisor on China and North-Fast Asia from 2005-2009 His co-authored book, China's Strong Arm: Protecting Citizens and Assets Abroad, was published in 2015 by IISS/Routledge and launched at the annual Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore. At Hudson Institute, he published a comprehensive report which conducted broad-based tracking of Chinese Communist party interference and influence in the US. Jonas has contributed to Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, Newsweek, American Interest and writes an international column for Danish daily Berlingske.

Samuel Chu



Mr. Chu is the founder and President of the Campaign for Hong Kong, Most recently, Samuel was the founding and managing director of the Hong Kong Democracy Council (HKDC), the first-ever DC-based organization for Hong Kong's pro-democracy movement. While leading HKDC, Samuel successfully advocated for the passage of landmark legislation such as the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act, the Hong Kong Autonomy Act, and numerous other policies supporting Hong Kong. In direct response, Hong Kong authorities issued arrest warrants against Samuel in July 2020, making him the first foreign citizen targeted under Hong Kong's National Security Law. Previously Samuel served as the national organizer for MAZON: A Jewish Response to Hunger, the founding president of the community organizing group, OneLA (Industrial Areas Foundation), and the founding and executive director of California Faith for Equality and California Faith for Equality Action Fund.

A first-generation immigrant from Hong Kong, Samuel is the son of the Rev. Chu Yiu Ming, co-founder of Occupy Central, which led to the Umbrella Movement in 2014. The elder Chu was later tried, convicted, and sentenced on protest-related charges in 2019.

Niva Yau

is Senior Researcher at the OSCE Academy in Bishkek and Fellow at the Eurasia Program of the Foreign Policy Research Institute in Philadelphia. Her work follows Global China affairs with a particular focus on China's foreign policy, trade and security in its western neighbourhood, including Central Asia and Afghanistan. She has conducted a number of commissioned research and brief officials on China affairs in Central Asia, including a congressional hearing for the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission in May 2022.



Ms Yau is quoted by news agencies globally, such as BBC, The Independent, Nikkei Asia, The Economist, VICE, Le Monde, Deutsche Welle, Al Jazeera and others. Originally from Hong Kong, Ms Yau has been based in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan since 2018, she is a native speaker of Cantonese, Mandarin, English and a learner of Russian.

Anton Bugayenko

is a research fellow at the OSCE Academy in Bishkek. He is formerly Head Expert of the Chinese and Asian studies program at Institute of World Economics and Politics (IWEP) under Foundation of the First president in Kazakhstan. He holds degrees in international policy from Fudan University and is an alumnus of Peking University's Dongfang Program.



Umedjon Majidi



Mr. Umedjon Majidi is an independent Anti-Corruption and Governance Consultant and Expert of the Eurasian Group on Combating Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism. He is a former Civil Society Capacity Building Program Coordinator of the Center for International Development, State University of New York and Open Society Foundation with expertise in Central Asian development analysis and research, civil organizations capacity building and institutional development, is based in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

He is a Founder and former Chairman of NGO Peshraft, an innovative education support promotion NGO in Tajikistan. Umedjon graduated from the University of Sussex, the United Kingdom in a Master of Arts in (Anti-) Corruption and Governance, Russian-Tajik Slavonic University in International Relations and Diplomacy, and holds a Ph.D. degree in International Relations and Foreign Policy, Tajikistan National University.

She is the founder of TOK TV in Georgia.



Temur Umarov



is a fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace and the OSCE Academy (Bishkek). His research is focused on Central Asian countries' domestic and foreign policies, as well as China's relations with Russia and Central Asian neighbors. A native of Uzbekistan, Temur Umarov has degrees in China studies and international relations from the Russian Presidential Academy of National Economy and Public Administration, and Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO).
