TINATIN KHIDASHELI –

heads a Georgian think-thank Civic IDEA, fighting the Soviet legacy in Georgia, confronting Russian and Chinese influence activities not only in Georgia but in a broader region of South Caucasus and Central Asia. Mrs. Khidasheli served as the first female Minister of Defense of Georgia (2015-2016). At different times, she chaired the Parliamentary Committee for European Integration as well as, was an elected member of the Tbilisi City Council, and founder and chair of the largest Human Rights advocacy group in the entire post-soviet space, the Georgian Young Lawyers' Association. Tinatin was a member of the National Anti-Corruption Council for four years under the president of Georgia. Under her editorship, the first Georgian-language book on the topic of hybrid wars, titled "Anatomy of Hybrid Warfare" was published.

ANI KINTSURASHVILI –

Senior Researcher at Civic IDEA, a Georgian NGO and Civil Society Institution, working on the issues of China's political, economic and information influence in Georgia and worldwide (February 2020-now). In 2015-2016, she served as an intern at the US Embassy and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia. She was awarded a certificate of appreciation for her exemplary dedication, tireless effort and exceptional resourcefulness in support of the US Embassy Regional Security Office. Ani is an alumnus of Tallinn University with a Master's Degree in International Relations, International Security and Conflict Studies.

Deputy Chief of Mission since June 2023. He previously held the same position in Kyiv, Ukraine, from 2021 to 2022. His extensive career at the State Department in Washington, D.C., includes roles such as Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor (2019-2020), and Deputy Director of the Office of Caucasus Affairs and Regional Conflicts (2011-2013). His overseas assignments span various countries, with previous tours in Georgia, Ukraine, Greece, Moldova, and Hungary. He is an alumnus of the University of Kentucky and the National War College.



ANTONINA LUSZCZYKIEWICZ –

the founding director of the "Taiwan Lab" (until February 2023). Former Fulbright Senior Scholar at Indiana University in Bloomington. Her primary focus is on the political and cultural history of China, as well as Sino-India relations. Professor Antonina has written over 130 papers on Sino-Indian relations, the Asian narrative of the Cold War, and other subjects. She is currently an assistant professor at Jagiellonian University.



ARMEN GRIGORYAN –

co-founder and president of the Yerevan-based Centre for Policy Studies; deputy editor of the Bulletin of Armenian Studies (journal of the National Academy of Sciences of Armenia); and a member of the advisory board of the project "Resilience in the South Caucasus: Prospects and Challenges of a New EU Foreign Policy Concept" implemented by the Institute of Slavic Languages and Caucasus Studies, Friedrich Schiller University Jena. He has published several book chapters, journal articles and policy papers, and nearly 400 articles and interviews in Armenian and foreign media.

Political Officer at the NATO Liaison Office for the South Caucasus in Georgia and also Polish diplomat. 
DALIBOR ROHAC –

research fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University. He co-chairs Hoover's project on China's Global Sharp Power and directs its research portfolio. He also works closely with government and civil society partners around the world to document and build resilience against authoritarian interference with democratic institutions. He currently serves on the executive committee of the University Research Security Professionals Association, an organization established to help heighten security awareness in academia. HEATHER A. CONLEY -

the President of the German Marshall Fund. She has held several notable positions, including Senior Vice President at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), where she oversaw Europe, Eurasia, and Arctic Affairs. She also headed the Permanent Delegation of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine to the NATO Parliamentary Assembly. From 2002 to 2007, Klympush-Tsintsadze was a correspondent for the Ukrainian Service of BBC Radio in the Caucasus, based in Tbilisi.



IVANA STRADNER -

a researcher at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD), specializing in Russia's security strategy and military doctrine, with a focus on probing Russian intelligence operations. Her research addresses both the psychological and technological aspects of Russian information security, as well as Russia's influence on international organizations. She is also a member of the Swedish delegation to the NATO Parliamentary Assembly. Previously, Lundgren has been a member of the Committee on the Constitution and a deputy member of both the Committee on Defense and the Committee on EU Affairs. From 2007 to 2018, she was part of the Swedish delegation to the Council of Europe, where she served as Deputy Chair of the Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe (ALDE).

is an environmental professional with 20+ year work experience. Mr. Eggert's previous roles include program host and commentator for TV Rain, Russia's pioneering independent TV channel (2016-2018), and Deputy Editor-in-Chief of Kommersant FM radio (2011-2015). From 1998 to 2009, Konstantin was with the BBC World Service, spending seven years as the BBC Russian Service Moscow Bureau Chief (2002-2009). He also worked in the private sector as Vice-President for Public and Government Affairs for ExxonMobil Russia Inc. (2009-2010). Konstantin began his career in print media in the 1990s, initially with Moscow's Kuranty daily and later as a diplomatic correspondent and deputy foreign editor with Izvestia daily. an investigative journalist based in Tbilisi, Georgia. He honed his skills as a news reporter with the UK Press Association and interned at the South London Press, The Sunday Times, and VICE News. His work spans major outlets such as the Guardian, Global Investigations Review, and the Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project, where he contributed to international investigations like Suisse Secrets and the European Press Prize-winning Russian Asset Tracker. Currently freelancing, Will covers the South Caucasus and broader Black Sea region for publications including Meduza, The New Humanitarian, The New European, and Euronews. He holds degrees in literature from the University of Cambridge and philosophy from University College London.




INSTANCE OF SAFEGUARDING (CYPRUS)


